DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 8th week, 1230 suspected dengue cases were reported in 25 districts in comparison to 1383, in 25 districts during the 7th week. There is 11.0% decrease in 8th week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 38.9% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 4.6%, rest of the Colombo District – 21.1%, Gampaha District – 8.9% and Kalutara District – 4.3%]. Jaffna [13.6%], Kandy [6.8%], Galle [6.0%], Kegalle [4.6%], Batticaloa [4.1%], Ratnapura [4.1%], and Kurunegala [3.7%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 8th week, 19 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. Of them, 7 MOH areas showed rising numbers than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 17 MOH areas in both 7th and 8th weeks.

The MOH areas that were newly flagged as high-risk areas in 8th week are Moratuwa and Kurunegala. The MOH areas that were flagged as high-risk in 7th week and not flagged for the current week are; Mawanella, Kopay, Nallur, Tellippalai, Kolonnawa, Piliyandala, Rathmalana, Biyagama and Panadura.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 7th week shows a decrease from 464 to 458.

In 8th week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 402. In 13 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 37 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the $8^{\rm th}$ week are illustrated in Table 3.
