DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 12^{th} week, 666 suspected dengue cases were reported in 24 districts in comparison to 863, in 26 districts during the 11^{th} week. There is 22.8% decrease in 12^{th} week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 44.6% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 5.1%, rest of the Colombo District – 20.1%, Gampaha District – 11.0% and Kalutara District – 8.4%]. Jaffna [11.4%], Kandy [6.5%], Kegalle [5.0%], Galle [4.7%], Ratnapura [4.5%] and Kurunegala [3.8%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 12th week, 9 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. Of them, 4 MOH areas showed rising numbers than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 5 MOH areas in both 11th and 12th weeks.

The MOH areas that were newly flagged as high-risk areas in 12^{th} week are Kurunegala, Kesbewa and Wattala. The MOH areas that were flagged as high-risk in 11^{th} week and not flagged for the current week are Battaramulla, Kelaniya and Panadura.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 11th week shows a decrease from 287 to 284.

In 12th week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 268. In 15 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 26 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 12th week are illustrated in Table 3.
