#### **DENGUE CASE REPORTING**

During the week 47, 1169 suspected dengue cases were reported in 23 districts in comparison to 1130 cases in 24 districts during the week 46. There is a 3.5% increase in the week 47, compared to the previous week (Table 1).

#### **HIGH RISK MOH AREAS**

Forty-four MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during the week 47. Out of them, 14 MOH areas showed rising number of cases in the week 47 compared to the week 46, and another 7 MOH areas show persistently high number of cases in both weeks 46 and 47 (Table 2).

In week 47 high risk level of MC Kandy and Harispattuwa MOH areas have come down while Padukka, Wennappuwa and Bandarawela MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.


# MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 69 hospitals throughout the country was 450\* and 528 during the week 46 and 47 respectively. In 27 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased in the week 47 when compared with the previous week.

DGH Negombo, National Hospital of Sri Lanka, Colombo South Teaching Hospital, Colombo North Teaching Hospital, PGH Badulla, National Institute of Infectious Diseases, and DGH Kalutara have reported the highest number of admissions (Table 3).

\*Average midnight total of the 46<sup>th</sup> week shows an increase from 439 to 450 when compared to the previous week's report due to delay in data reporting.
