DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 08, 1663 suspected dengue cases were reported in 26 districts in comparison to 1604 cases in 25 districts during the week 07. There is a 3.7% increase in week 08, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases 50.3% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 7.2%, Rest of the Colombo District – 15.9%, Gampaha District – 21.6% and Kalutara District – 5.7%]. Puttalam [6.3%], Rathnapura [4.7%], Kandy [4.4%], Kalmunai [4.1%] and Batticaloa [4.0%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Fifty-four MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 08. Out of them, 08 MOH areas showed a rising number of cases in week 08 compared to the week 07, and another 46 MOH areas showed persistently high number of cases in both weeks 08 and 07 (Table 2).

In week 08 high risk levels of Kolonnawa, Dompe, Mirigama, MC Jaffna, Karaveddy, Wennappuwa, Yatiyantota and Alayadivembu MOH areas have come down while MC Kandy, Talatuoya, Yatiyantota, MC Galle, Chavakachcheri, Batticaloa, Bingiriya, Eheliyagoda, Embilipitiya, PS Rathnapura, Kegalle and Ruwanwella MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 75 hospitals throughout the country was 584 and 596 during the weeks 07 and 08 respectively. In 22 hospitals, the average midnight total has decreased and in 30 hospitals the average mid night total has increased in the week 08 when compared with the previous week. Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of admissions in the week 08 are displayed in Table 3.

*Average midnight total of the 07th week shows an increase from 574 to 584 when compared to the previous week's report after updated with delayed reporting from hospitals.
