DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 14, 1801 suspected dengue cases were reported in 25 districts in comparison to 1461 cases in 26 districts during the week 13. There is a 23.3% increase in week 14, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases 47.7% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 3.3%, Rest of the Colombo District – 17.2%, Gampaha District – 22.7% and Kalutara District – 4.6%]. Trincomalee [7.6%], Kandy [6.0%], Batticaloa [5.3%], Kegalle [4.5%] and Galle [3.9%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Fifty-two MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 14. Out of them, 19 MOH areas showed a rising number of cases in week 14 compared to the week 13, and another 33 MOH areas showed persistently high number of cases in both weeks 14 and 13 (Table 2).


In week 14, high risk levels of Rathmalana, Bandaragama, Kalutara (NIHS), Baddegama, Tellippalai and Yatiyantota MOH areas have come down while Kolonnawa, Nugegoda, Hanwella, Gothatuwa, Beruwala (NIHS), Harispattuwa, MC Galle, Point Pedro, Karaveddy, Kinniya, Kuchchavely, Eheliyagoda, Dehiovita, Ruwanwella, Sammanthurai and Sainthamaruthu MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals throughout the country was 554 and 620 during the weeks 13 and 14 respectively. In 22 hospitals, the average midnight total has decreased and in 29 hospitals the average mid night total has increased in the week 14 when compared with the previous week. Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the week 14 are displayed in Table 3.

*Average midnight total of the 13th week shows an increase from 543 to 554 when compared to the previous week's report after updated with delayed reporting from hospitals.
