DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 25, 2120 suspected dengue cases were reported in 26 districts in comparison to 2477 cases in 26 districts during the week 24. There is a 14.4% decrease in week 25, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases 47.7% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council -3.5%, Rest of the Colombo District – 18.1%, Gampaha District -19.3% and Kalutara District –6.9%]. Kandy [10.5%], Rathnapura [6.4%], Kegalle [5.2%], Galle [4.8%], Kurunegala [4.5%] and Batticaloa [3.2%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Sixty-one MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 25. Out of them, 9 MOH areas showed a rising number of cases in week 25 compared to the week 24, and another 50 MOH areas showed persistently high number of cases in both weeks 25 and 24 (Table 2).

In week 25, high risk levels of Homagama, Boralesgamuwa, Egoda Uyana, Dompe, Poojapitiya, Menikhinna, Walasmulla, Sooriyawewa, Okewela, Balapitiya, Hikkaduwa, Akuressa, Karaveddy, Vavunatheevu, Oddamavadi, Kekirawa, Kurunegala, Embilipitiya, MC Ratnapura, Dehiovita, Kegalle and Bulathkohupitiya MOH areas have come down. Pitakotte, Padukka, Bandaragama, Horana, Kurunduwatta, Talathuoya, MC Matale, Ambalangoda, Habaraduwa, Karandeniya, MC Matara, Pannala, Kalpitiya, Kuruwita and Pelmadulla MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals throughout the country was 863 and 722 during the weeks 24 and 25 respectively. In 16 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 36 hospitals the average mid night total has decreased in the week 25 when compared with the previous week. Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the week 25 are displayed in Table 3.

*Average midnight total of the 24th week shows a decrease from 868 to 863 when compared to the previous week's report after updated with delayed reporting from hospitals.

WEEKLY DISTRIBUTION OF DENGUE PATIENTS in 2022 and 2023


