

#### **DENGUE CASE REPORTING**

During 40<sup>th</sup> week, 684 suspected dengue cases were reported in 21 districts in comparison to 526, in 24 districts during the 39<sup>th</sup> week. There is 30% increase in 40<sup>th</sup> week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 43.3% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council -6.9%, rest of the Colombo District – 14.5%, Gampaha District -17.7% and Kalutara District – 4.2%]. Kandy [18.7%], Galle [7.3%], Matale [4.7%], Kurunegala [4.2%], Jaffna [3.4%] and Badulla [3.4%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

### **HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)**

During 40<sup>th</sup> week, 16 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. Of them, 15 MOH areas showed rising numbers than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 2 MOH areas (MC Kandy and MC Galle) in both 39<sup>th</sup> and 40<sup>th</sup> weeks.

The MOH areas that were flagged as high-risk in 39<sup>th</sup> week and not flagged for the current week are; Gothatuwa and Beruwala. The MOH areas that were newly flagged as high-risk areas in 40<sup>th</sup> week are Piliyandala, Moratuwa, Attanagalla, Kelaniya, Dompe, Ragama, Gampola, Kundasale, Udunuwara, Matale and Badulla.

#### MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

\* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 39th week shows an increase from 198 to 199

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals was 271 in 40<sup>th</sup> week. In 38 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 11 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 40<sup>th</sup> week are illustrated in Table 3.
