

DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 46th week, 1798 suspected dengue cases were reported in 24 districts in comparison to 1586, in 24 districts during the 45th week. There is 13.4% increase in 46th week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 40.9% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 6.2%, rest of the Colombo District – 17.9%, Gampaha District -13.0% and Kalutara District – 3.9%]. Kandy [17.8%], Galle [8.6%], Kurunegala [6.1%], Puttalam [5.8%], and Kegalle [4.4%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 46th week, 50 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. Of them, 35 MOH areas showed rising numbers than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 40 MOH areas in both 45^{th} and 46^{th} weeks.

The MOH areas that were newly flagged as high-risk areas in 46th week are Pita Kotte, Boralesgamuwa, Katana, Minuwangoda, Habaraduwa, Rathgama, Eravur, Kurunegala, MC Kurunegala, Ruwanwella and Eheliyagoda. The MOH areas that were flagged as high-risk in 45th week and not flagged for the current week are; Attanagalla, Kalutara (NIHS), Gampola, MC Matale, Menikhinna, Batticaloa and Kuliyapitiya.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 45th week shows an increase from 684 to 700.

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals was 812 in 46th week. In 33 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 19 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 45^{th} week are illustrated in Table 3.

KEY ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED DURING WEEK 46 AT NATIONAL LEVEL

- The new National Dengue Surveillance System (NaDSys) is being introduced island-wide which is more comprehensive and robust. The present Dengue Sentinel Site Surveillance (DenSyS) will be replaced with the new system; Training of REs, MOOH, ICNOs and PHII has already been completed in Colombo, Gampaha, Kandy, Nuwara Eliya, Matale, Ratnapura, Kegalle, Galle, Anuradhapura, Polonnaruwa, Jaffna, Vavuniya, Mannar, Mullaitivu, Kilinochchi, Badulla, Moneragala, Trincomalee, Ampara, Batticaloa, Puttalam and Kegalle districts.
- In view of the local outbreaks in Kandy District, extensive entomological surveys were conducted in high-risk MOH areas, targeting the public institutions and intersectoral actions were strengthened for dengue prevention and sustainable control.
