DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 18, 1209 suspected dengue cases were reported in 24 districts in comparison to 1102 cases in 23 districts during the week 17. There is a 9.7% increase in week 18, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases 44.9% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 5.0%, Rest of the Colombo District – 15.5%, Gampaha District – 11.0% and Kalutara District – 13.5%]. Jaffna [6.7%], Trincomalee [5.8%], Ratnapura [4.0%], Galle [6.3%] and Kandy [6.3%] districts also has reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Sixty- nine MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 18. Out of them, 26 MOH areas showed rising number of cases in week 18 compared to the week 17, and another 15 MOH areas show persistently high number of cases in both weeks 17 and 18 (Table 2).

In week 18 high risk level of Gampaha, Dompe, Wadduwa, Gampola, Gangawatakorale, Balapitiya, Walasmulla, Weligama, Kayts, Chenkalady, Kaluwanchikudy, Akkaraipattu, Kalmunai South, Puttalam, Balangoda, PS Rathnapura, Kiriella, Warakapola and Yatiyantota MOH areas have come down while Kolonnawa, Borelasgamuwa, Kahathuduwa, Meerigama, Ragama, Tangalle, Mulatiyana, Point Pedro, Korali Pattu (Central), Seruwila, Kurunegala, Pannala, MC Rathnapura, Kegalle, Mawanella and Ruwanwella MOH Areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 69 hospitals throughout the country was 401* and 438 during the weeks 17 and 18 respectively. In 19 hospitals, the average midnight total has decreased in the week 17 when compared with the previous week (Table 3).

*Average midnight total of the 17th week shows an increase from 390 to 401 when compared to the previous week's report after updated with delayed reporting from hospitals.

WEEKLY DISTRIBUTION OF DENGUE PATIENTS in 2021 and 2022


