DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During the week 07, 1604 suspected dengue cases were reported in 25 districts in comparison to 1672 cases in 25 districts during the week 06. There is a 4.1% decrease in week 07, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases 52.9% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 6.3%, Rest of the Colombo District – 16.4%, Gampaha District – 24.2% and Kalutara District – 6.0%]. Puttalam [9.2%], Kalmunai [4.6%] Trincomalee [3.9%] and Kurunegala [3.8%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

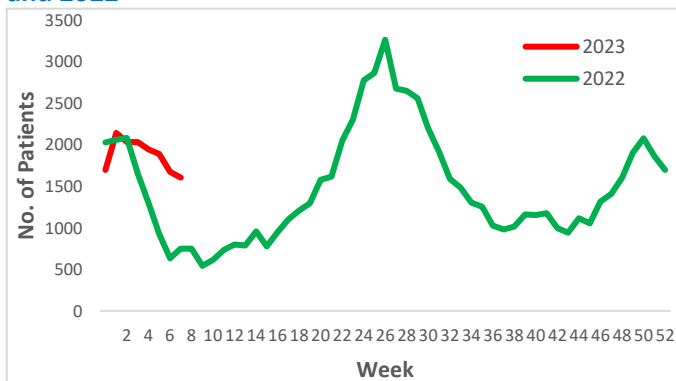
Fifty MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during week 07. Out of them, 09 MOH areas showed a rising number of cases in week 07 compared to the week 06, and another 33 MOH areas showed persistently high number of cases in both weeks 07 and 06 (Table 2).

In week 07 high risk levels of Wadduwa, Gampola, MC Kandy, Telippalai, Batticaloa, Warakapola, Eheliyagoda and Sainthamaruthu MOH areas have come down while Homagama, Kolonnawa, Divulapitiya, Karaveddy, Chenkalady, Uppuveli, Wennappuwa, Badulla, Yatiyantota and Addalaichchenai MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 75 hospitals throughout the country was 604 and 574 during the weeks 06 and 07 respectively. In 34 hospitals, the average midnight total has decreased and in 19 hospitals the average mid night total has increased in the week 07 when compared with the previous week. Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of admissions in the week 07 are displayed in Table 3.
