WEEKLY DENGUE UPDATE

DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 50th week, 2438 suspected dengue cases were reported in 26 districts in comparison to 2730, in 25 districts during the 49th week. There is 10.7% decrease in 50th week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 33.6% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 4.4%, rest of the Colombo District – 15.2%, Gampaha District - 9.2% and Kalutara District - 4.8%]. Jaffna [17.7%], Kandy [14.8%], Puttalam [5.6%], Badulla [5.3%], Batticaloa [4.5%] and Kurunegala [4.1%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 50th week, 62 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. Of them, 24 MOH areas showed rising numbers than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 54 MOH areas in both 49th and 50th weeks.

The MOH areas that were newly flagged as high-risk areas in 50th week are Minuwangoda, Beruwala (NIHS), Kalutara (NIHS), Wadduwa, Talatuoya, Telippalai, Chankanai, Chenkalady, MC Kurunegala and Godakawela. The MOH areas that were flagged as high-risk in 49th week and not flagged for the current week are; Kolonnawa, Ja-Ela, Seeduwa, Bandaragama, Habaraduwa, MC Galle, Nattandiya, Dehiowita, Mawanella, Ruwanwella, Warakapola and Eheliyagoda.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 49th week shows a decrease from 1011 to 1010.

In 50th week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals was 969. In 27 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 27 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 50th week are illustrated in Table 3.
