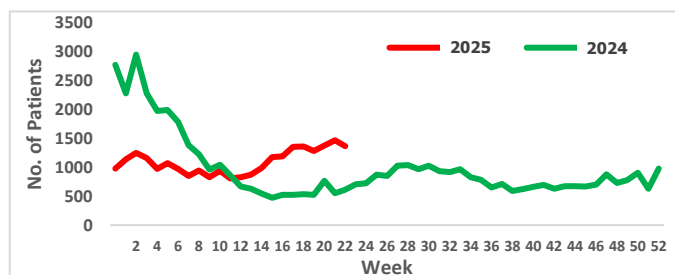

DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 22nd week, 1364 suspected dengue cases were reported in 24 districts in comparison to 1468 in 23 districts during the 21st week. There is 7.1% decrease in 22nd week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 43.4% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council - 5.1%, rest of the Colombo District - 18.3%, Gampaha District - 16.1% and Kalutara District - 3.9%]. Rathnapura [13.0%], Kandy [9.1%], Kegalle [4.7%], Batticaloa [4.5%], Galle [3.9%], and Kurunegala [3.8%], districts also have reported higher proportions of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 22nd week, 39 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk; 20 MOH areas showed rising number than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 29 MOH areas in both 21st and 22nd week of 2025.

Udunuwara, Koralai Pattu Central, Kinniya, Medirigiriya, Mawanella, Balangoda, Egodaunya, Attanagalla and Pugoda newly flagged as high-risk MOH areas in the 22nd week. Gangawata Korale, Dehiovita, Kalawana, Eheliyagoda, CMC – D1, CMC- D2B, Boraesgamuwa, Rathmalana, Moratuwa, Divulapitiya, Minuwangoda, Ragama, and Pitakotte MOH areas flagged as high-risk in the 21st week, were not flagged in the current week.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

** After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 21st week shows an increase from 473 to 491.*

In the 22nd week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 494. In 18 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 22 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 22nd week are illustrated in Table 3.
