DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 32nd week, 1329 suspected dengue cases were reported in 24 districts in comparison to 1492 cases in 25 districts during 31st week. There is a 10.9% decrease in 32nd week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 42.8% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council -2.4%, rest of the Colombo District - 16.2%, Gampaha District -17.8% and Kalutara District -6.4%]. Kandy [19.6%], Galle [7.3%], Ratnapura [5.5%], Kegalle [4.4%] and Kurunegala [3.8%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS

Forty-three MOH areas were flagged as high-risk areas during 32nd week. Out of them, 13 MOH areas showed a rising number of cases in week 32 compared to 31st week and 29 MOH areas showed persistently high number of cases in both weeks 32 and 31 (Table 2).

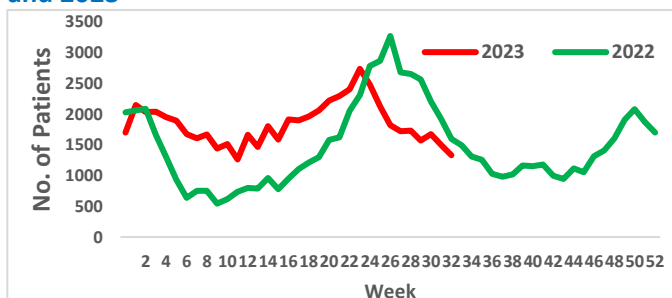
In 32nd week, high risk levels of Dehiwala, Homagama, Pita Kotte, Battaramulla, Attanagalla, Mirigama, Kalutara (NIHS), Poojapitiya, Yatinuwara, Ukuwela, Kalpitiya and Rambukkana MOH areas have come down. Kolonnawa, Dompe, Minuwangoda, Doluwa, Udunuwara, Badulla, Eheliyagoda, Pelmadulla and Ruwanwella MOH areas were newly identified as high-risk areas.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total of the 31st week shows a reduction from 553 to 551.

Average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 73 hospitals throughout the country was 551 and 489 during the 31st and 32nd weeks respectively. In 21 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 30 hospitals the average mid night total has decreased in the 32nd week compared to the previous week. Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 32nd week are displayed in Table 3.
