DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 39^{th} week, 624 suspected dengue cases were reported in 23 districts in comparison to 590 in 24 districts during the 38^{th} week. There is 5.8% increase in 39^{th} week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 50.6% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 9.5%, rest of the Colombo District – 17.3%, Gampaha District – 16.0% and Kalutara District – 7.9%]. Kandy [9.9%], Galle [6.9%], Ratnapura [6.3%], Matara [4.5%] and Kegalle [3.7%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 39th week, 10 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. Of them 6 MOH areas showed rising number than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 5 MOH areas in both 38th and 39th weeks.

Devinuwara, Siyabalanduwa, Homagama and Kolonnawa newly flagged as high-risk MOH areas in the 38th week. MC Galle, Kundasale and Maharagama MOH areas flagged as highrisk in the 39th week, were not flagged in the current week.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 38th week shows an increase from 222 to 226.

In the 39th week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 214. In 17 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 20 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 39th week are illustrated in Table 3.


