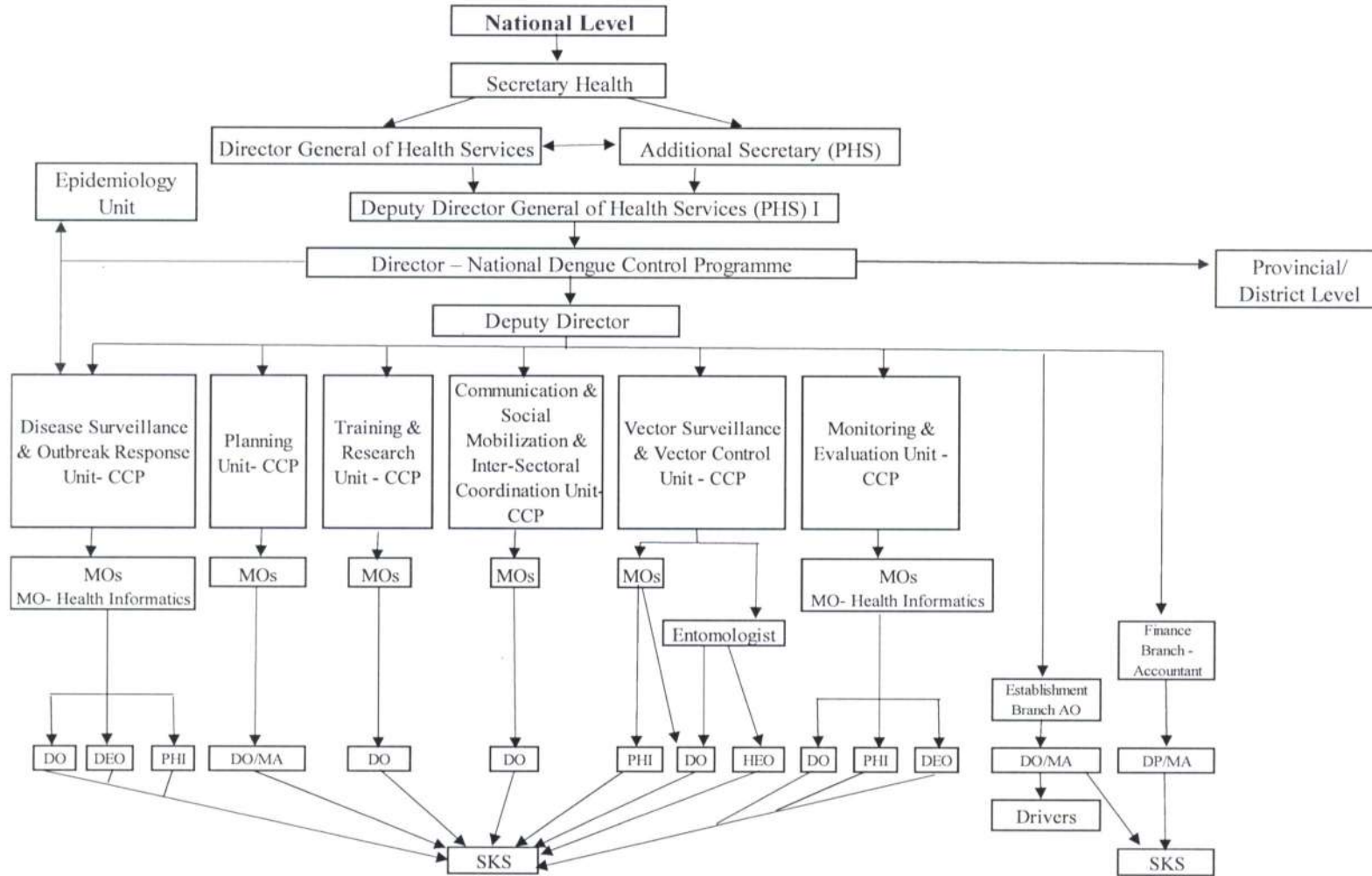

Monitoring and Evaluation Unit	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Overall management, coordination, monitoring and evaluation according to the annual action plan, strategic plans and National Action Plan on Prevention and Control of Dengue 2019 – 2023 and beyond – Monitoring and Evaluation of data, data flow and databases – Develop/ update supervision formats for relevant categories, develop Terms of Reference for supervisory activities. – Develop formats and a review mechanism for district-level dengue control activities through Regional Epidemiologist. – Develop a review mechanism of vector surveillance activities at the district level through Entomologist. – Carry out a national dengue review (Epidemiological/Entomological) bianually with compiled data. – Facilitate carrying out of regular progress reviews at the central unit – NDCU for all staff categories (including the progress of achievement of action plan activities by responsible units). – Monitoring of new developments – Provincial and Regional Reviews of Dengue status – Generate bi-annual reports by compiling disease surveillance, vector surveillance and control activities and premise inspection data – Prepare other progress reports (SDG/Central bank, Budget debate), and disseminate to relevant authorities – Facilitate mortality reviews

Disease Surveillance and Outbreak Response Unit	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ensure timely data entry into DenSys from identified sentinel sites, identify expansions required - Ensure timely collection, compilation, analysis and dissemination of epidemiological data and reports - Facilitate mapping of disease data - Ensure generation of alerts for the areas having impending outbreaks - Monitor impending outbreaks and mobilization of rapid response teams and coordination of necessary outbreak prevention activities - Continuous monitoring of outbreak response and post-evaluation - Conduct operational research on disease dynamics to generate new evidence and disseminate the findings to relevant stakeholders - Improve and monitor clinical surge capacity

Training and Research Unit	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Local training – Identify capacity building requirements at national level, provincial/ district and divisional levels, both in curative and preventive sectors - Organizing International training programmes - Review and training on clinical guidelines - Assist in developing necessary research proposals of the other units, support in taking ethical and administrative clearances for those proposals and once the research is completed, disseminate the results to relevant authorities - Service delivery analysis and identify areas for development - Capacity building on Dengue based research - Development of summary notes based on the Dengue research studies in Sri Lanka, consultative meetings and, technical reports for the website and Facebook page - Organise and conduct the research committee to identify research priorities - Provide training and resources, and dissemination of new research findings among stakeholders
