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DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 16^{th} week, 526 suspected dengue cases were reported in 22 districts in comparison to 472, in 23 districts during the 15^{th} week. There is 11.4% increase in 16^{th} week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 35.9% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council – 4.9%, rest of the Colombo District – 14.4%, Gampaha District – 10.5% and Kalutara District – 6.1%]. Kandy [12.7%], Ratnapura [9.9%], Kegalle [8.2%], Jaffna [6.3%], Galle [4.9%] and Trincomalee [4.8%] districts also have reported higher number of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 16th week, 4 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. All 4 MOH areas showed rising numbers than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in CMC and MC Kandy in both 15th and 16th weeks.

The Gothatuwa and Point Pedro MOH areas were newly flagged as high-risk in 16^{th} week.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 15th week shows decrease from 204 to 196.

In 16th week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 197. In 16 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 22 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 16^{th} week are illustrated in Table 3.
