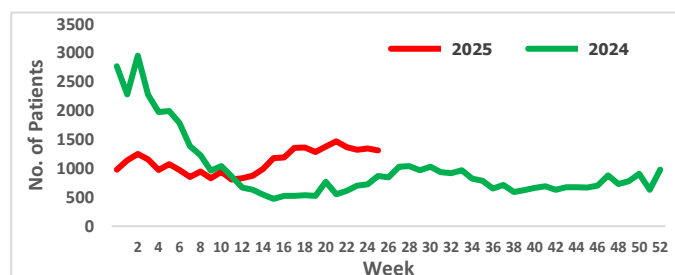

DENGUE CASE REPORTING

During 25th week, 1312 suspected dengue cases were reported in 26 districts in comparison to 1345 in 25 districts during the 24th week. There is 2.5% decrease in 25th week, compared to the previous week. Of all reported cases, 38.5% were from Western Province [Colombo Municipal Council - 2.1%, rest of the Colombo District - 17.9%, Gampaha District - 14.0% and Kalutara District - 4.4%]. Kandy [14.9%], Rathnapura [8.5%], Galle [6.4%], Kurunegala [4.9%], Matara [3.9%], and Kegalle [3.4%] districts also have reported higher proportions of cases (Table 1).

HIGH RISK MOH AREAS (Table 2)

During 25th week, 34 MOH areas were flagged as high-risk. 25 MOH areas showed rising number than their respective numbers in previous week. Persistently high number of patients are observed in 21 MOH areas in both 24th and 25th week of 2025.

Kundasale, Kurunegala, Kayts, Baddegama, Elpitiya, MC Galle, Ambalantota, Hanwellla, Battaramulla and Nugegoda newly flagged as high-risk MOH areas in the 25th week. Point Pedro, Chankanai Walikamam West, Karaveddy, Kuruvita, Rathnapura MC, Muttur, CMC- D3, CMC- D4, Egodaunya, Piliyandala, Ja-Ela and Pugoda MOH areas flagged as high-risk in the 24th week, were not flagged in the current week.

MIDNIGHT TOTAL OF DENGUE PATIENT ADMISSIONS

* After updated with delayed reporting from hospitals, average midnight total for the 24th week shows a decrease from 506 to 505.

In the 25th week average midnight total of dengue patients in selected 74 hospitals was 486. In 21 hospitals, the average midnight total has increased and in 28 hospitals it has decreased compared to the previous week.

Selected hospitals with high average midnight totals of dengue patients and changing trend of dengue admissions in the 25th week are illustrated in Table 3.

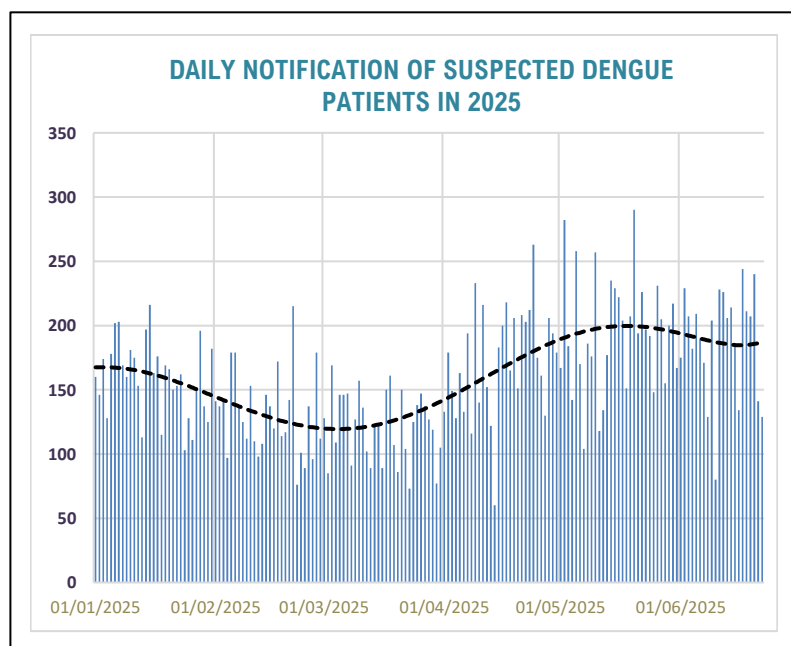
